

# Suspension and Expulsion Data by Department of Family and Community Services Districts



Previously, suspension and expulsion data was published by region and school education group. Changes to the Public Schools NSW regional structure require that a different reporting format be used. Therefore it will not be possible to directly compare data from 2013 onwards to previous years.

The 2013 data is set out in the 15 Family and Community Services districts. Publication of data in this way will assist evidence informed planning and practice across NSW Government agencies.

Data published prior to 2013, in education regions, is not comparable with the 2013 data published by Family and Community Services districts.

<u>Please note:</u> From time-to-time, the Department of Family and Community Services may change the boundaries of their districts. Therefore, care is needed in interpreting this data overtime.




