



LANGUAGE BACKGROUND OTHER THAN ENGLISH, 2003

This bulletin reports the results of the census of students of language background other than English in New South Wales government schools undertaken by the NSW Department of Education and Training on Friday, 7 March 2003. A student of language background other than English is defined as one in whose home a language other than English is spoken.

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INTRODUCTION

In Term 1 2003, 196,651 students enrolled at government schools were identified as being of Language Background Other Than English (LBOTE). This represented 25.8 percent of all government school enrolments compared to 25.0 percent in 2002.

ENROLMENTS OF STUDENTS OF LANGUAGE BACKGROUND OTHER THAN ENGLISH BY DISTRICT AND LEVEL/YEAR OF SCHOOLING, TERM 1 2003

LBOTE student enrolments represented 25.7 percent of all primary enrolments and 25.8 percent of all secondary enrolments in government schools.

Districts varied widely in the number and percentage of LBOTE students. Fairfield district had the highest enrolment with 23,326 LBOTE students, representing 77.3 percent of district enrolment. Granville district enrolled 18,838 LBOTE students, 83.8 percent of district enrolment. In Granville, Fairfield, Bankstown, Port Jackson, Liverpool, Bondi, Parramatta and St George districts, LBOTE students represented more than half of all enrolments.

The largest increases in the number and percentage of LBOTE enrolments occurred in Parramatta, Mt Druitt and Hornsby districts:

- In Parramatta district, the LBOTE enrolment grew from 13,687 students (51.0% of district enrolment) in 2002 to 14,442 students (53.2%) in 2003.
- In Mt Druitt district, the LBOTE enrolment grew from 9,013 students (32.6% of district enrolment) in 2002 to 9,560 students (35.2%) in 2003.
- In Hornsby district, the LBOTE grew from 9,876 students (35.3% of district enrolment) in 2002 to 10,398 (37.4%) in 2003.

Year 11 (28.5%) and Year 12 (30.6%) had the greatest proportions of LBOTE enrolments. Of the 2,709 LBOTE students in secondary support classes, 61.4 percent were enrolled at Intensive English Centres.

Year 9 was the year of schooling with the greatest increase in the proportion of LBOTE enrolments, from 23.6 percent in 2002 to 24.9 percent in 2003.

Chinese, with 35,248 students in 2003, has been the most common language background other than English in government schools since 1997. Chinese students represented 17.9 percent of all LBOTE students in 2003 compared with 17.6 percent in 2002.

Arabic, with 25,180 students in 2003, was the most common language background from 1988 to 1996. The proportion of LBOTE students of Arabic background decreased from 14.1 percent in 2002 to 12.8 percent in 2003.

The number of students of Japanese language background increased from 1,636 in 2002 to 1,775 in 2003, an increase of 8.5 percent, the largest percentage increase. The number of students of Tamil language background increased from 2,475 in 2002 to 2,662 in 2003, an increase of 7.6 percent.

The number of students of Hindi language background decreased from 7,833 in 2002 to 7,231 in 2003, a decrease of 7.7 percent.

The number of students of Arabic language background decreased from 27,122 in 2002 to 25,180 in 2003, a decrease of 7.2 percent.

There were high numbers of students from particular language backgrounds in the following districts.

- Bankstown District: Arabic (4,596), Chinese (1,764) and Vietnamese (1,311).

- Bondi District: Chinese (2,129).
- Fairfield District: Arabic (2,772), Chinese (3,979), Khmer (1,350), Spanish (1,134) and Vietnamese (5,039).
- Granville District: Arabic (5,868), Chinese (3,718), Turkish (1,121) and Vietnamese (984).
- Hornsby District: Chinese (3,664), Korean (946).
- Liverpool District: Arabic (2,688), Chinese (1,377), Hindi (1,592), Italian (806), Samoan (991), Serbian (1,174) and Vietnamese (1,703).
- My Druiitt District: Arabic (796), Hindi (865), Samoan (1,279), and Tagalog (1,454).
- Northern Beaches District: Chinese (1,259).
- Parramatta District: Arabic (1,223), Chinese (3,682), Farsi (923), Hindi (833) and Korean (875).
- Port Jackson District: Chinese (2,312).
- Ryde District: Chinese (3,853) and Korean (1,033).
- St George District: Arabic (3,135), Chinese (4,680), Greek (2,518) and Macedonian (1,076).

Khmer was the language with the highest concentration in one district, with 62.6 percent of students of Khmer language background in schools in Fairfield district.

Government preschools enrolled 893.6 full-time equivalent students of Language Background Other Than English in 2003, representing 41.3 percent of all government preschool enrolments, compared with 38.4 percent in 2002. Arabic, Chinese and Vietnamese were the most common language backgrounds, representing 16.0 percent, 15.4 percent and 13.7 percent, respectively, of all Language Background Other Than English preschool students.

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


